





Ruddigore trivia: The original title of the operetta was Ruddygore but this caused considerable offence and was considered unsuitable for a family audience. A friend commented that he saw no difference between Ruddygore and Bloodygore which gained the response "Then I suppose you'll take it that if I say I admire your ruddy countenance I mean I like your bloody cheek". Gilbert eventually changed the title to Ruddigore.
