Concert

2019 sees the centenary of the establishment of the Women's Institute Federation in Bedfordshire (the first UK WI was set up in 1915). Stewartby Operatic Society's annual spring concert will be dedicated to celebrating this momentous occasion with a selection of music spanning the last hundred years.

The performance on Thursday 16th May is exclusive to the Women's Institute.

Annual General Meeting

The Society's Annual General Meeting was held on Thursday 7th March.

Our chairman, Colin Jones, recapped the events of the last year covering the spring concert, the annual dinner, two jumble sales, rehearsals for and production of Ruddigore and the concert at St James's Church in Little Paxton.

The Treasurer, Mike Cocke, presented the accounts which showed that, as with most of our November productions, we made a loss on Ruddigore. For the year as a whole there was also a negative balance but smaller than that in the previous year. Mike thanked John Daniels for auditing the accounts.

Colin explained the proposed amendments to the constitution and membership subscriptions. At present the AGM must be held before the end of March which means

that it falls in the middle of rehearsals for the spring concert. The proposal was to move the AGM and, therefore, the subscription year so that they come between the spring concert and the beginning of rehearsals for the November production. At the same time the financial year will move to end in March rather than January. The proposal was agreed by the

members present. Also agreed was the removal of the requirement that anyone auditioning for the November production must be a paid-up member of the Society, but the committee reserves the right to make a discretionary charge for auditionees.

The choice of production for November 2020 was confirmed as The Yeomen Of The Guard and there was discussion regarding possible changes to the style and/or venue of the spring concert and of concerts in general.


Committee Members - Bill Hall, Jenny Hall, Shirley Hale, Richard Hull and Carol Urwin



Parking for Stewartby Village Hall

Sometimes it is difficult to find parking near Stewartby Village Hall. This is recognised by the Trustees of the village hall and they are trying to source additional off-road parking. In the meantime and in discussion with the Trustees we would like to remind members and visitors that there are two car parks available: one on the right-hand side of the village shop (opposite the hall) and the other on the left-hand side of the shop in front of Stewartby Club.



Both of these car parks are quite small, however, so you may have to park on the road. Please do not park on the grass verges: there are new road signs around the hall to remind you of this. Also you must not park so as to obstruct residents' access nor to impede the potential passage of an emergency vehicle. Cones will be deployed around the hall to restrict parking to one side of the road only.

You are reminded that if you park illegally you may receive a penalty fine.

Please also remember to leave the village hall quietly so as not to disturb local residents.

Following the AGM subscriptions become due. As the subscription year has been extended, as discussed at the AGM, covering the period from 7th March 2019 to 31st May 2020 the


subscriptions have also been "extended". For £12 for Associate Members. After next year's
