Gilbert and Sullivan's The Gondoliers

The Gondoliers, subtitled The King of Barataria, opened at the Savoy Theatre on Saturday 7th December, 1889, and ran for 554 consecutive performances. The company and orchestra also performed at Windsor Castle in front of Queen Victoria.

Gilbert and Sullivan's previous operetta had been The Yeomen of the Guard and its more operatic style had been so much more to Sullivan's liking that he needed some convincing to return to the frivolity and topsyturvyness of comic opera.

The story is a satire on the emerging enthusiasm for republicanism and egalitarianism.

The Gondoliers has the longest vocal score of any of the G&S works with the first fifteen minutes of the show unbroken by dialogue.








The Story


