Our business manager, Mike Cocke, produced some interesting statistics about the show.

- · 427 tickets were sold out of a maximum of 650 for the five performances, nearly 66%
- · the most popular night was Friday when 83% of seats were occupied
- · approximately 40% of tickets were sold online, a big increase on last year
- the show made a loss of several hundred pounds, an improvement on last year!


