Restarting rehearsals

Assuming that the government's Roadmap out of Lockdown goes to plan we will recommence rehearsals on Thursday 20th May, 2021. As such the rehearsals will be held as formal meetings with all precautions taken to limit the possible spread of the coronavirus. No social interaction will be permitted in the hall and no refreshments will be available.
