Last November

The Society's production of Gilbert and Sullivan's The Mikado was something of a gamble which



turned into a great success. Being our first full scale production after the pandemic lockdown restrictions there was no guarantee that our audience would return. After much debate it was decided to trial a change in performance days and times: the Tuesday performance was scrapped and Saturday's was moved to the afternoon slot.

It may have been the popularity of The Mikado, it may have been the performance changes, it may have been post-pandemic release but the production was a great success, playing to full or nearly full houses for each performance, gaining two award nominations from NODA and, for the first time for many years, making a profit at the box office.


Annual General Meeting

Musings re his contribution to the next Spring Concert, from Peter Davis

In 1997 the films Volcano and Dante's Peak came out. Coincidence? So too did Deep Impact and Armageddon. The same with A Bugs Life and Antz. Themes pop up and they are everywhere for a while. Likewise, in the 1820s 'sleepwalking' or 'somnambulism' was a thing. Various theses on it were written and fictional novels. This led to Bellini agreeing to write an opera based on it and thus La Sonnambula was born.

When you hear the name Bellini, maybe you think of Giovanni Bellini the famous painter from Venice, in fact from a famous family of painters. Maybe, you think of the Bellini cocktail made of prosecco and peach puree, created in Harry's Bar in Venice as a tribute to one of the paintings by Giovanni Bellini. Or, maybe you misheard and thought of the blini, a little pancake. This is none of those, this is Vicenzo Bellini the famous composer, who died tragically young at 33. When one hears the phrase 'bel canto', Italian for 'beautiful singing', then one automatically thinks of Rossini and Donizetti, but most of all Bellini.

La Sonnambula is a simple tale of a woman on the day before her wedding meeting up with the other villagers and her fiancé. A stranger arrives, asking the way to the castle. This being an opera he starts singing. He remembers this place. The briefest of recitatives — "Il mulino, il fonte...il bosco!... E vicin la fattoria!..."

"The mill...the stream...the woods!... and the farm nearby..."

And then we are off into the aria -

"Vi ravviso, o luoghi ameni," "Again I see you, O lovely scenes,..."

This is the aria that I will be singing, I hope you enjoy it. I was asked to sing it at the Gala night for the Beds Music festival a few years ago. The adjudicator told me I had a beautiful cadenza. I felt like saying that hers wasn't too bad either, but I held my tongue and checked on the definition of this musical term. Apparently, it means an improvised or written-out

ornamental passage sung by a soloist, usually in a 'free' rhythmic style, and often allowing virtuosic display. So now you know, and I hope that I can live up to it.


As for La Sonnambula, she sleepwalks into Rodolpho's bedroom, which causes all sorts of ructions, and they are a bit more serious than Gilbert would have set them!
